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Education Minnesota announcement on reopening buildings:

Wednesday, Gov. Tim Walz announced that the state is updating the Safe Learning Plan so that starting on Jan. 18, schools can resume in-person instruction for preschool- and elementary-aged children – but only if schools adopt strict requirements for safety equipment and policies.

These strategies include providing and requiring staff to wear a face shield and mask, and offering routine testing, among other measures.

Also, we know schools can't reopen if they have too many staff members who are sick or in quarantine, which common sense says is related to the amount of community spread of the virus.

Middle and high schools will still be subject to the state's original school reopening rules, and many that have moved to online learning will have to stay there until local virus case numbers drop significantly.

We also need to keep in mind that the pain of the pandemic has not been shared equally. Communities of color in Minnesota represent a disproportionate share of the people infected, hospitalized and killed by the disease. Appropriately, the plan presented today gives districts and families some freedom to choose a learning model that works for them.

In short, the topline message about this plan is that it is workable and that there is a lot to like in it. It uses science and starts with the youngest learners. It uses phase-ins, a couple grade levels at a time. It puts strict mitigation protocols in place. However, the plan requires everyone doing the right things, outside and inside the school building.

Please be assured that Education Minnesota will continue to do everything in our power to make sure learning environments are safe for students and staff.

Our Education Minnesota team will analyze the changes in the Safe Learning Plan and will release our guidance early next week.

Education Minnesota Collective Bargaining and Organizing Conference


Saturday, Jan. 30, 2021

National Education Association Conference is the primary legislative and policymaking body of the Association and derives its powers from, and is responsible to, the membership. The Representative Assembly adopts the strategic plan and budget, resolutions, the Legislative Program, and other policies of the Association. Delegates vote by secret ballot on proposed amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws. Those delegates with full voting rights elect the executive officers, Executive Committee members, and atlarge members of the NEA Board of Directors.

The Families First Coronavirus Response Act

Expires on December 31 establishes two separate and temporary paid leave laws, which run from April 1 – Dec. 31: the Emergency Paid Sick Leave Act and the Emergency Family and Medical Leave Expansion Act. These laws provide emergency paid sick leave and some partially paid parental leave protections to eligible employees who need to provide care to their children because of school and child care closures.
