

#### AHEM Meets with Subgroup of School Board Members

On Monday, March 29, a small delegation of AHEM members met with three school board members to discuss issues of concern. Because of the public meeting law, only three Board members are allowed to meet without a public notice. Conversations included workload, elementary specialists concerns, awareness of SPED programs, large class sizes, and the lack of funding affecting all areas of our work environment. It was a productive session, with active listening and identifying first steps to solve issues, or, at least, to gain more information to enhance greater understanding.

Passing a Board Resolution for fully funding public education was suggested to show support and convey a unified message in order to persuade the Legislature to recognize the financial needs of our district.

# PEIP Public Employee Insurance Program

Currently our District has what's called "self-insured" which means only district employees and their family members are part of the health care plan. Since the pool is smaller, just a few catastrophic incidents can

# **Government Relations Update**

The MN legislature is in recess this week before the second half of the session starts April 6th. Senate Republicans proposed \$152 million in new funding for preschools through high schools over the next two years, while House Democrats want \$722 million in new dollars. The House DFL is on par with Gov. Tim Walz's Due North plan at \$750 million.

The state house recently moved forward appropriation for summer programming (HF 1064 passes). There are many bills in hearing or laid over status at this point.

Last week, a number of bills passed from committee in an attempt to move forward from COVID-19 closures, including requiring the MCA for all school districts, pausing new education standards, opening the door to more qualified substitute teachers (SF 819 advances to floor) and ease budget pressures by allowing schools more flexibility to move money to the area it is needed most (SF 710 passes the Senate).

Here is the upcoming session timeline and schedule for Education Minnesota's issue-based lobby events and AHEM specific lobby events. All lobby events will be held virtually, and times are typically at the end of the elementary school day.
