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INVOLUNTARY TRANSFER SEASON

After the District lays off probationary teachers, it begins the process of involuntary transfers. Teachers can be transferred for many reasons, including enrollment, District reorganization, or building construction, to name a few. The procedure for involuntary transfers is explained in your working agreement (contract) on pages 31 and 32.

Involuntary transfers shall be based on total District seniority. Teachers will be given a choice of three positions within their licensure area, and interviews are not required. Involuntary transferred teachers shall be placed in positions before voluntary transfers or outside applicants are interviewed. Teachers who are involuntarily transferred will be notified by July 1 of their assignment for the following school year, unless agreed upon by administration and the teacher.

Unemployment Seminar

At its March 29, 2021, School Board meeting, the Anoka-Hennepin School Board approved non-renewing over 260 probationary teachers. Teachers, under contract with the District, should continue to receive benefits and compensation through the end of the 2020-21 school year, which includes full pay, plus health and dental insurance benefits, until August 30, 2021.


With a heavy heart.....

Government Relations Update

After approval through House Finance last week on party line votes, the education omnibus (HF1065) and early childhood omnibus (HF2230) bills were in the House Ways and Means Committee on Wednesday and Thursday. The Ways and Means Committee's job is literally to find the ways and means to raise revenue to fund bills in general. The companion, SF960, awaits action by the Senate Taxes Committee. Sen. Roger Chamberlain (R-Lino Lakes) is the sponsor. The proposed \$20.8 billion biennial education budget includes additional funding for special education and English Language learner cross-subsidy aid, extending 4,000 voluntary prekindergarten seats, increasing transportation sparsity aid, and providing a 2% increase to the general education formula each fiscal year, as well as tying the formula to inflation in future years.

Statewide broadband access has stumbled and right now seems to be getting maybe 30 million of the original 120 million proposed.

The Senate also had the higher education omnibus on the floor Wednesday.
