65 Days Without a Contract Negotiations Update

August 30, 2021

The negotiations team hopes your return to work this fall, whether it was several weeks ago or just today, goes smoothly.

This is where things stand after our **9th** bargaining meeting with the district on August 27th.

The super-quick update is that, no, we have not reached a tentative agreement yet.

Before diving into information more specific to where we are at, just a quick reminder of where we started. The budget bill passed by the Minnesota legislature in June provided an increase of 2.45% and 2% in funding for education over the next two years. In the District's initial proposal to AHEM, however, the district placed 0% and 1% on many places on the salary schedule.

Your negotiations team is looking for increases in salary, step and lane movement, health insurance contributions, and 403(b) matches, which are all funded from the additional funding from the state. Currently the District and AHEM are millions apart in a total package.

In terms of language items, we have agreed on several items that are largely corrections or clarifications to existing parts of the contract. The district has been reluctant to agree to anything that would impact what they see as their managerial rights. Your negotiators will continue to present proposal alternatives based on the issues you all brought forward to us; we still consider most proposals open for inclusion in a final agreement.

The next bargaining date with the district is September 14th.

Please wear red on Wednesdays, as a sign of solidarity and unity. A sea of red in your buildings will help send a strong message that we are united in the goal of a settlement that recognizes the work we all do for students.
