## Additional Legal Services Added for Members Only

The Education Minnesota/NEA/AFT Legal Services Policy is a cooperative

Education Minnesota/NEA/AFT program that is designed to ensure that members receive appropriate legal assistance in matters relating to their employment.

New legal coverage has been added to the Legal Services Policy for Long Term Disability. If the legal department determines that a member's claim for long term disability benefits has been denied and warrants litigation or mediation against the insurance carrier, Education Minnesota will cover up to \$9,000 in attorneys' fees and \$3,000 in litigation costs.
