We've got the NAC!

The Negotiations Team is doing things differently next round. One of our early steps to involve even more of you in the process is recruiting a Negotiations Advisory Committee (or NAC). The NAC will consist of representatives from groups that may be less represented in the process than traditional classroom teachers. Some examples might be counselors, adult basic education, nurses, or early intervention program teachers. This is by no means a comprehensive list.

So what will the NAC do? Our initial plans are to have the group meet about once per trimester during the 2022-23 school year. Members of NAC will help the Negotiations Team better understand unique situations faced by members of the bargaining group and potentially help develop proposals to impact your work in the district. Subgroups of the NAC or individuals may meet more often to provide additional feedback. NAC members must be members of AHEM.

Legislative Updates

MN Legislature: The MN House and Senate passed the frontline workers bill last week, resulting in:

1. 500 million for 667,000 Minnesotans who served the public during COVID, including you. This could mean up to \$750 each.

- 2. Replenishing the depleted unemployment trust fund, 1.7 billion
- 3. Making hourly school workers eligible for unemployment benefits. This a big win for paras and other school staff!

Education Omnibus Bill: Tell your legislators to support the provision in**HF4300** that invests in student support personnel! This legislation would give districts dedicated funding to hire the student support personnel needed to meet recommended student-to-staff ratios so we can make sure every Minnesota student has access to the mental and physical health staff they need in school!

Upcoming Pledge to Vote: Let's make sure our teachers are out in full force this election! Next week, May 9th-13th, we are asking each building to hold a nonpartisan Pledge to Vote event. Be on the lookout for communication from your Head Building Rep and/or a Worksite Action Leader!

Our WALs Program is BACK!

If you were here in 2018 you might remember a person in your building being referred to as a WALs, which stands for Worksite Action Leader. This person helps facilitate Get Out The Vote events at your site. Get Out The Vote events are fun, creative events at your building that promote voting in the upcoming gubernatorial election. There is money available to you to make these events fun and interactive. We also have staff that are able to provide you with some ideas, and assistance if needed.

Expectations – In the fall 2022 school year, host 2 non-partisan voter engagement activities in your building. Share non-partisan voter education materials about the candidates with members in your building. Conduct one-on-one conversations with targeted voters in your building. Participate with at least one other member from your site in a door knock for an EDMN endorsed legislature, and stay in contact with our GOTV leaders Aaron Balzer and Jinna Collins-Jwacu.

Training- Attend one 60 minute training on either Tuesday and Thursday at 5pm starting May 10th. New WALs should attend a single 1-hour training: *WALs Trainings*

Pay – There is a \$150 stipend available for a WAL at each building.
