

AHEM attends The Big Parade for Little People



AHEM President and staff attended the Big Parade of Little People on Friday October 28 to hand out popcorn and engage with parents and the community.

Over 500 bags of popcorn were passed out with a message sticker on each bag. The message included an invitation for parents to attend a gathering to learn how we can work together to improve our student's experiences. There is one inperson opportunity to meet, and one virtual opportunity, both in December.

Meet and Confer with the School Board

On Wednesday, 11/2/22, about 50 people attended the first Meet and Confer of the school year. The meeting began with AHEM Secretary/VP, Jon Kohnen, updating past topics, and the progress that has been made. Next Andover High School ESL teacher, Amna Kiran, spoke about the difficulty her students have in taking the written driver's test, and advocated for the Board to sign a petition, and to work with the DMV to rewrite the questions so students could easily understand the meaning. Then Frank Kratochvill from

Megan was followed by President Val Holthus and Laura Bratland, Andover Elem. who spoke about retention of probationary teachers and the challenges of attending the many meetings that are required for elementary teachers. Laura also spoke about how the LETRS training could be accomplished more efficiently and tailored to teachers' abilities and schedules.

Finally, Peter Groebner, STEP/Virtual HS, spoke on why the AHVA should continue. The virtual academy

Andover High School spoke about how the contract addresses robotic coaches' compensation.

The next speakers were Annie Schweizer and Cheryl Luckow from Sunrise Elementary and ESC SPED, respectively, who spoke about recruiting and retaining speech pathologists. Then Megan Rafferty from Mississippi Elementary addressed retaining and recruiting substitute teachers. She said buildings should make sure those substitute teachers are given the assignment they had signed up to do. Often subs come to a job, and they are pulled to do something else, and will choose not to return to that building again.

Contract Connections Vol 2, No 4

As your negotiations team continues to prepare for bargaining for the next contract starting in spring 2023, we are in the midst of gathering information from a variety of sources to best represent your wants and needs as educators in the next contract.

An important part of that is hearing from members directly. There are several opportunities to talk directly to the team over the coming weeks and months:

- Turkey Bingo, November 17th Negotiations Team members will be present and available to talk during the event.
- Member Listening Sessions, January 10th and 18th - Virtual

The Negotiations team is also working to engage members of the community. Other districts that have fought for even greater wins in their contract have included members of the community in the conversations. Ultimately there are issues in which we can work together with parents and community members to improve the educational experience for students and educators alike. To that

- Building Meetings Building representatives can contact the team about having a building meeting with team members. There are a lot of sites in the district and not many team members, so we have been asking building reps to have a critical mass of people at a site.

- Negotiations Advisory Committee (NAC) - The NAC is designed to increase the representation of members of the bargaining unit in non-traditional classroom roles. NAC will begin meeting in January.


