

We Need More Support Staff

Educators concerned about the mental and physical health of their students urges legislators <u>last Tuesday</u> to pass <u>Senate File 56</u>, which would pay school districts to hire dedicated staff to improve student health and safety.

The bill provides \$96 million next year and \$106 million in 2025 of ongoing, sustainable funding so each school district and charter school in Minnesota can hire a licensed school nurse, social worker, counselor or psychologist.

Minnesota has one of the worst ratios of students-to-counselors in United States, in some cases with one employee assigned to more than 700 students. With more mental and physical health needs than ever, there's more urgency from lawmakers and educators to fill this staffing gap and provide holistic health teams for students in schools. We pulled *this moment* of support from Sen. Erin Maye Quade, it speaks exactly to what we're fighting for.

Minnesota Teacher of the Year

Nine Anoka-Hennepin Teachers are Candidates for Minnesota Teacher of the Year

This year's program will name the 59th Minnesota Teacher of the Year. The program celebrates the tradition of excellence in teaching in Minnesota. Eligible candidates include pre-kindergarten through 12th-grade, Early Childhood Family Education and Adult Basic Education teachers, from public or private schools.

An independent panel of leaders in the fields of education, business, government, nonprofit and philanthropy will read candidates' portfolios over the next few weeks and narrow down the list to a group of semifinalists. In March, the panel will convene again and review additional materials from the semifinalists to choose a group of finalists. The Minnesota Teacher of the Year banquet is set for May 7 at the Saint Paul RiverCentre.
