Message to Members

This year, we have had a few incidents of white teachers using the N-word while working with students in the context of either explaining to students that the word does not belong in an educational setting no matter what student uses it, or when pre-teaching approved literature curriculum in which the N-word is used.

AHEM does not condone teachers using the full word in an educational setting and knows the use of this word causes harm and intensifies racism and inhumanity that people of color have long endured.

We understand that moving forward with any process regarding this matter should center on race and racism, and that centering the voices and values of our members and students of color will be vitally important as we attempt to heal as a community.



Pensions: We are well into the legislative process with pension bills. Several have been proposed, including HF2222/SF1938, which among other things normalizes age 62 or 35 years of service as our new retirement age for those who do not qualify for Rule of 90 and double counts service during the years 2020-2022. 
