The union locals of the largest school districts in Minnesota held a press release at the state Capitol on Friday, March 17. The locals that were present represented an astounding 20% of the state's students. In the press release it was announced that all of our largest districts are filing their intent to bargain simultaneously. We communicated a message that we are all united in bargaining for a contract that gives students and educators what they need.



AHEM was represented by President Val Holthus, and Amna Kiren, Andover HS, and Natasha Brown-Guhin of Anoka HS. Amna spoke about the needs of her English language learners and Natasha spoke about the need for smaller class sizes. St. Paul teachers spoke about school safety, and Minneapolis educators

advocated for fixing the teacher shortage and attracting BIPOC people to teaching.

Dakota County United Educators (DCUE) spoke about requiring more resources and mentioned that teachers know best what their students need. Osseo teachers spoke about teachers of

color mentorship programs and mental health needs and smaller special education caseloads. Robbinsdale mentioned that ESPs and paras need to earn a living wage, at least \$25.00 per hour.

Post-Spring Break Updates

Thank you to those of you that completed the negotiations survey. Over 1,300 members submitted a response to the survey for a response rate of about 46%. The negotiations team will need some time to review and analyze the responses before we can share back information with all of you. Many, many of you took the time to share specific ideas, with one of the open response questions yielding over forty pages of comments. As the team reads through what you have shared, we will combine it with ideas you have shared previously to develop the goals and priorities for the upcoming round of bargaining.

On Friday, March 17th AHEM filed our Intent to Bargain notice with the district. This notice is the official notification to the district that opens the bargaining process. It will still likely be two months or more before we start actually meeting with the district team. Several other large locals also filed their notices that same day and joined AHEM in a press conference at the capitol advocating for the many needs across the educational spectrum. Together the locals represent educators supporting and teaching 20% of students across the state. We achieve more together!


