Negotiations Update #9

Hello AHEM Members,

The AHEM and District Negotiations teams will meet for bargaining session #6 at the ESC on October 23rd.

The district team has indicated that the district chief financial officer will be present to provide an updated look at district finances. As a team over the last several months, your AHEM negotiators has taken our own look into the district's financial situation in light of the legislation passed last spring. Comparing the two views of the districts' finances should be interesting. At the next session, it will also be the district team's "turn" to present a financial proposal for the contract.

As bargaining continues, we have a few "asks" for action for you all. While there are five members of the negotiation team at the table with our Education Minnesota field staff supporting us, it is really ALL of us that are bargaining. The union is not a separate group that we belong to, it is all of us working together to improve education for our students and as a profession. To that end, please:

- Make sure you are receiving bargaining updates at your home email. If you are not getting them, check your junk folder or email <u>Becky.Marshman@edmn.org</u> to update your information.
- 2. **Continue to wear red on Wednesdays**. When everyone wears red it sends a strong message to the district that we are unified, giving our negotiations team more leverage at the table.
- 3. **Rally at the school board meeting.** Monday, October 23, 6:30pm at Sandburg. Wear red and come early to pick up or make a sign and donate a food item!
- 4. **Vote!** Elect School Board Candidates that support teachers, students, and our schools.

Some of you have reached out to ask about additional actions we can take as a local to support negotiations. Our Local Contract Action Team (LCAT) works with the negotiations team to develop a structured plan of action over time. If you are looking for a way to learn more about negotiations or have ideas on actions you would like to see us take as a local, consider joining LCAT.

Cultural Competency Training

Description of Complete 1 - 4 Series

This series is designed to deepen educators' understanding of their own frames of reference, the potential bias in these frames, and their impact on expectations for and relationships with students, students' families, and the school communities. Participants will engage in self-reflection and discussion around the following topics: racial, cultural, and socioeconomic groups; American Indian and Alaskan native students; religion; systemic racism; gender identity, including transgender students; sexual orientation; language diversity; and individuals with disabilities and mental health concerns.

Module #1: Expanding Your Equity Lens (2 1/2 hours)

Equity work is a journey, and in this session, we will lay the foundation for centering equity work in your community. Participants will ground themselves with norms and vocabulary and develop and understanding of the importance of intercultural competency.

AHEM is offering Series 1 on October 17th and October 24th. Please only choose one, due to class size limitations. To move on to the next module and to satisfy re-licensing requirements, you must complete the previous module.





2023 NCUEA Fall Conference

The National Council for Urban Educators Offers Grants to Attend Fall Conference in New Orleans

NCUEA created a program called Discovery Grants to promote ethnic and racial diversity at our *Fall Conferences*. The program hopes to encourage and strengthen the involvement of ethnic minority members in the activities and leadership of NCUEA. We have allocated funds to send new ethnic minority participants to the Fall Conference.

The Fall conference provides new leaders with the opportunity to connect to one another, learn best practices related to organizing and advocacy, as well as receive highquality professional practice development.



NCUEA awards grants only to first-time ethnic and racial minority conference participants to attend its 2023 Fall Conference. Individuals can submit their applications <u>here</u>. The application deadline is **October 27, 2023**. NCUEA will notify all accepted applications no later than **Friday**, **November 3, 2023**. *NCUEA* will only consider one grant for AHEM.

The grant will cover the registration fee, travel expenses (airfare or mileage), and hotel costs for three nights. All other expenses will be the responsibility of the local association or grant awardee.
